Proposals to Amend (No.2) the New Zealand (Maximum Residue Limits of Agricultural Compounds) Food Standards 2013 Submissions close 3 March 2014

The New Zealand Food (Supplemented Food) Standard 2013 which commenced on 5 December 2013 adopting Standard 1.2.7 of the Australian New Zealand Food Standards Code. The 2010 version of this Standard has been included in the 2013 Standard as Part 2. Supplemented Foods may comply with either Part 1 or Part 2 of the Standard until 17 January 2016 when Part 2 is repealed.

Proposal P274 - Review of minimum age labelling of foods for infants: to align the labelling requirements of Standard 2.9.2 - Infant Foods of the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code (the Code) with current infant feeding guidelines in Australia and New Zealand.  P1030 – Health Claims for Sports Foods & Electrolyte Drinks: to permit sports foods to carry health claims about physical performance and sport-related beneficial physiological effects and to enable electrolyte drinks to make self-substantiated health claims beyond current limited permissions.

- A1092 Irradiation of Specific Fruits: to seek permission to irradiate 11 specific fruits (apple, apricot, cherry, nectarine, peach, plum, honeydew, rockmelon, strawberry, table grape, zucchini and scallopini (squash) for phytosanitary purposes
- <u>A1094 Food derived from Herbicide-tolerant Cotton DAS-81910-7:</u> to seek permission for food derived from herbicide-tolerant cotton genetically modified to provide resistance to 2,4-D and glufosinate-ammonium.

11 November 2013

• <u>P1029 Maximum Level for Tutin in Honey</u>: to develop a permanent maximum level for tutin in honey.

5 November 2013

• <u>A1091 – Enzyme Nomenclature Change – Carboxyl Proteinase to Aspergillopepsin I & II</u>: to seek amendments to the processing aid Standard to update the current entry for the enzyme carboxyl proteinase.

22 August 2013

• <u>A1090 – Addition of Vitamin D to Breakfast Cereal:</u> to permit the addition of vitamin D to breakfast cereal.

26 July 2013

- <u>A1088 Sodium Hydrosulphite as a Food Additive</u>: to include sodium hydrosulphite (sodium dithionite) as a food additive to be used in the processing of canned abalone.
- <u>P1028 Infant Formula Products</u>: to revise and clarify standards relating to infant formula products comprising category definitions, composition, labelling and representation of products.

• <u>P1027 – Managing Low-level Ag & Vet Chemicals without Maximum Residue Limits</u>: to manage low-level agricultural and veterinary chemicals without MRLs (i.e. the food is not listed in schedule 1 of Standard 1.4.2, but the chemical is).

• <u>P1026 – Lupin as an Allergen</u>: to consider options to regulate food containing lupin as a food allergen.

17 December 2012

• P1024 – Revision of the Regulation of Nutritive Substances and Novel Foods: to develop an alternative framework for the regulation of nutritive substances (currently defined in Standard 1.1.1) and novel foods (currently regulated in Standard 1.5.1) in the Code.
